CSU Research Team Publishes Paper in AGU Journal

A team of CSU researchers studying pyrogenic carbon has recently had their work accepted for publication into the American Geophysical Union's Global Biogeochemical Cycles journal. The paper is entitled "Redistribution of pyrogenic carbon from hillslopes to stream corridors following a large montane wildfire." The work is highly interdisciplinary, involving researchers from the Natural Resource Ecology Laboratory, the U.S. Forest Service, and the CSU Departments of Soil and Crop Sciences, Chemistry, Ecosystem Science and Sustainability, Civil and Environmental Engineering, and Geosciences.
