Aurora Water

- Dependent on snowpack for 95% of primary water supply
- Reservoirs
 - 12 storage reservoirs
 - In multiple counties (Eagle, Pitkin, Lake, Pueblo, Otero, etc.)
- Cherry Creek Well fields
 - Alluvial, renewable (shallow & pulls for Cherry Creek)
 - Deep Aquifer, non-renewable
- Multiple facilities across the state
 - Office in Otero County (Rocky Ford)
 - Staff in Park County (Spinney Mt. Reservoir)
 - Staff in Weld County (Prairie Waters North Campus)
- Multiple facilities across Aurora
 - 3 drinking water treatment facilities
 - 1 reclaimed water treatment facility



Aurora Water

 - 1 Water Reclamation Facility

 - Water supply
 - Water Treatment and Distribution
 - Sanitary Sewer service
 - Storm Drainage maintenance
- **Raw Water System**
 - 132 miles of pipe
 - 922 Valves
 - 9 Raw Water Pump Stations
 - 3 raw water storage tanks
 - 12 reservoirs
- **Distribution system**
 - 1,617 miles of pipe
 - 43,900 Valves
 - 13,552 Fire Hydrants
 - 8 Potable Water Pump Stations
 - 11 Potable Water Storage Reservoirs (Tanks)
- **Stormwater system**
 - 732 miles of mains
 - 12,533 manholes
 - 16,919 inlets
 - 1,183 ponds
- **Wastewater system**
 - 1,198 miles of mains
 - 31,596 manholes
